9. Committee Updates

- Benefits & Compensation Committee – Chair Silvestrini
 - Meetings held 1/23/25 & 2/13/25
 - Next meeting 3/13/25
 - Discussed at the last meeting was moving to a 7-year rolling CPI average, based on the All Cities index
 - This compromise was reached between the Board and Local 1696
 - Also discussed was compression between the ranks and the need for incentive to progress
 - Also included for recommendation was the merit adjustments for sixteen civilian positions
 - This recommendation to the Board will result in a 3.6% COLA
 - Council Member Stewart pointed out that he previously suggested that the Board consider a 90th percentile rather than the Top 3 concept
 - No further discussion
- Governance Committee – No current Chair
 - No meeting held
 - Chief Burchett noted that the ILA is up for its 5-year review
 - A Governance Committee Meeting will be scheduled in the coming months
 - Anyone interested in joining or Chairing the Governance Committee, please reach out to Chief Burchett
- Finance Committee – Chair Henderson
 - Next meeting 4/10/25

10. Administration & Planning Report

- Legislative Update
 - AC Pilgrim provided an update to current bills
 - HB048 – Wildfire Risks
 - There remain many questions on risk, costs, etc.
 - A proposal to set up an assessment program is proposed
 - UFA or the Utah State Fire Chief's Association (USFCA) will be at the table for discussions
 - UFA and USFCA will be working collaboratively with Forestry Fire & State Lands (FFSL) on solutions based on the final bill
 - HB307 – Cooperative wildfire system funding mechanism
 - HB65 – FF Cancer bill amendments to increase the presumptive cancers from 4 to 15
 - Multiple EMS/Ambulance bills are on the watchlist as well
 - This has been a busy session, with a lot of challenging last minute meetings
- 2024 Accomplishments Poster
 - The Board reviewed the final draft poster
 - The goal of the poster is to catch all the work and accomplishments from 2024 as identified in the Strategic Plan

11. Support Services Report

- EM Hazardous Mitigation Plan
 - Emergency Manager Behunin provided an overview of what EM has been working on
 - SLCo sought and received federal funding that allowed pre/post mitigation funding
 - Activities and hazards within SLCo were reviewed and updated
 - Once the mitigation plans are complete, they will be reviewed by FEMA
 - Following FEMA's approval, the plans will be shared with the municipalities and approved

12. Operations Report

- AC Dern presented the report from last month
 - Compared to January 2024, there has been an increase of 229 calls
 - Although it was a lean snow year, calls in the canyons have also increased
- Canyon Response Update
 - AC Dern explained the staffing in the canyons and the increase from 3 to 4 handed crews
 - This change in the response model has helped
 - There are now ample individuals to handle emergent calls
 - Transport turnaround time for the ambulance to return up the canyon impacts response
 - For non-emergent calls now, an ambulance comes from the valley and the care is transferred to them
 - The crew can now go back into service in the canyon quicker
 - The change in the model is doing what it was intended to do
 - Council Member Fotheringham questioned the status of the SLCo recreation funding
 - Chief Burchett replied that the process is ongoing
 - SLCo is working to identify a facilitator
 - No further information
 - Council Member Buroker inquired as to any information/data on the high number of cancelled/enroute incident types
 - AC Dern explained that this is a Wicked Issue as there is a possibility for cost savings, however, it is difficult to solve
 - Data is kept on cost per hour of operating time for each apparatus
 - Solutions are being explored to possibly manage various calls with a low acuity response unit, rather than sending the heavy apparatus
 - Work is currently being done to address this exact issue
 - Mayor Gettel asked if data is kept on how often Narcan is administered
 - AC Dern explained that yes, use is tracked, and a community risk reduction program will be focused on hot spots for Narcan overdoses, interventions, etc.
 - This information is available to municipalities if requested

13. Fire Chief Report

- Introduction to Women FF Class UFRA
 - Local 1696 Vice President Swenson explained her role in overseeing the Utah Fire & Rescue Academy (UFRA) women FF class
 - UFRA hosts the event and Engineer Swenson recruits women from other agencies as mentors
 - There are multiple camps for those under 18, but few for women over 18
 - This event is advertised on social media and through all agencies throughout Utah
 - Mayor Gettel stated that Midvale would be interested in helping support this effort in the future
- Federal Funding Update
 - Chief Burchett stated that there is a lot of uncertainty and there are no solid answers with these cuts
 - Chief has asked all Divisions to report their reliance on federal funding
 - USAR and Emergency Management are the main Divisions in UFA that currently receive funding and they are confident that their daily operations will not be impacted
 - Although, future grant opportunities are unknown
 - Funding for deployments shouldn't be impacted
 - This is all being watch closely
 - The funding for the BLM Station Project at Fire Training is fully funded through the design process
 - The BLM is hoping to get the funding for phase 2, building the station

- UFA is comfortable moving forward with the design phase
- Chief Burchett is just looking for a general consensus from the Board on continuing to move forward with the design phase
- No comment, no one opposed

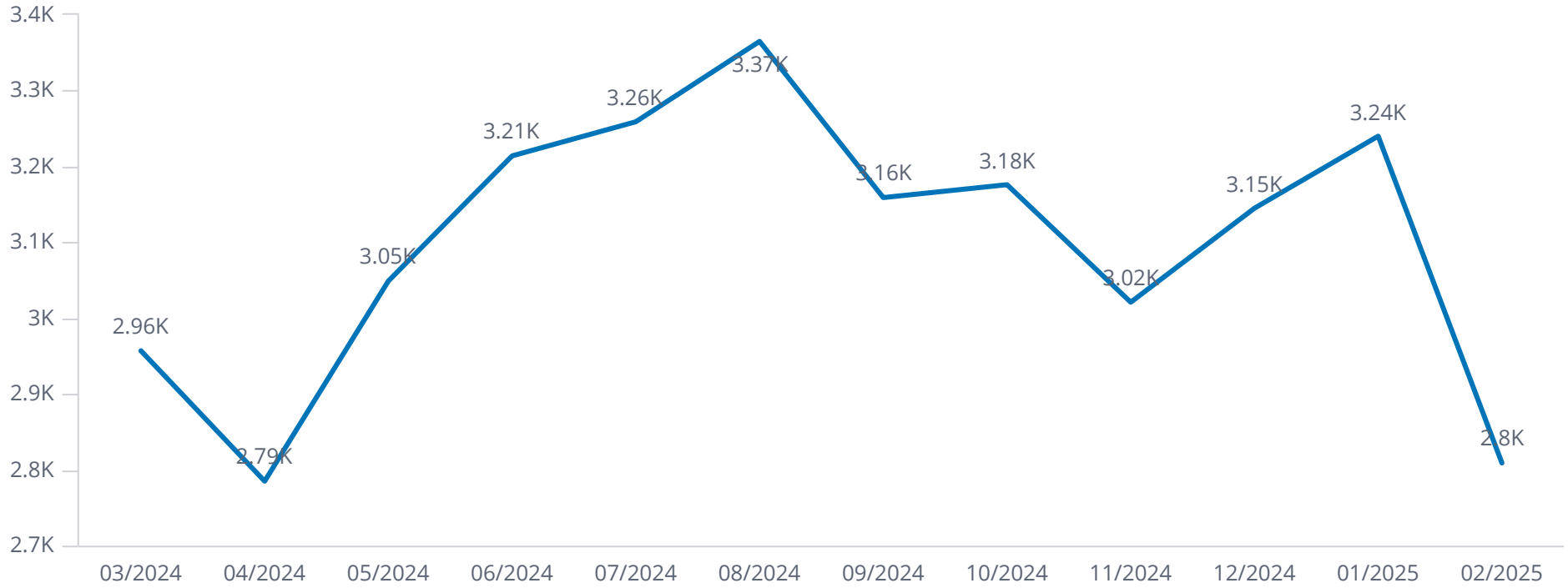

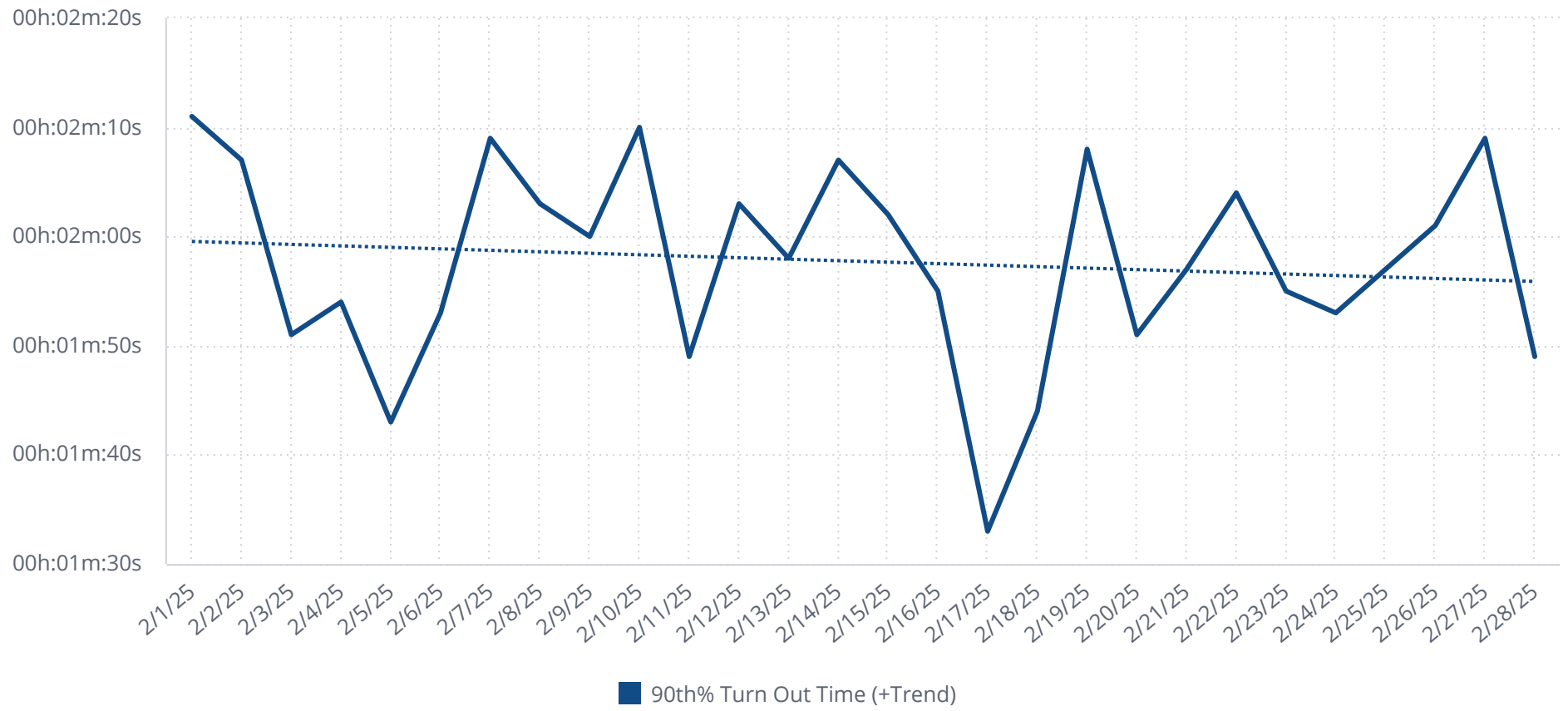

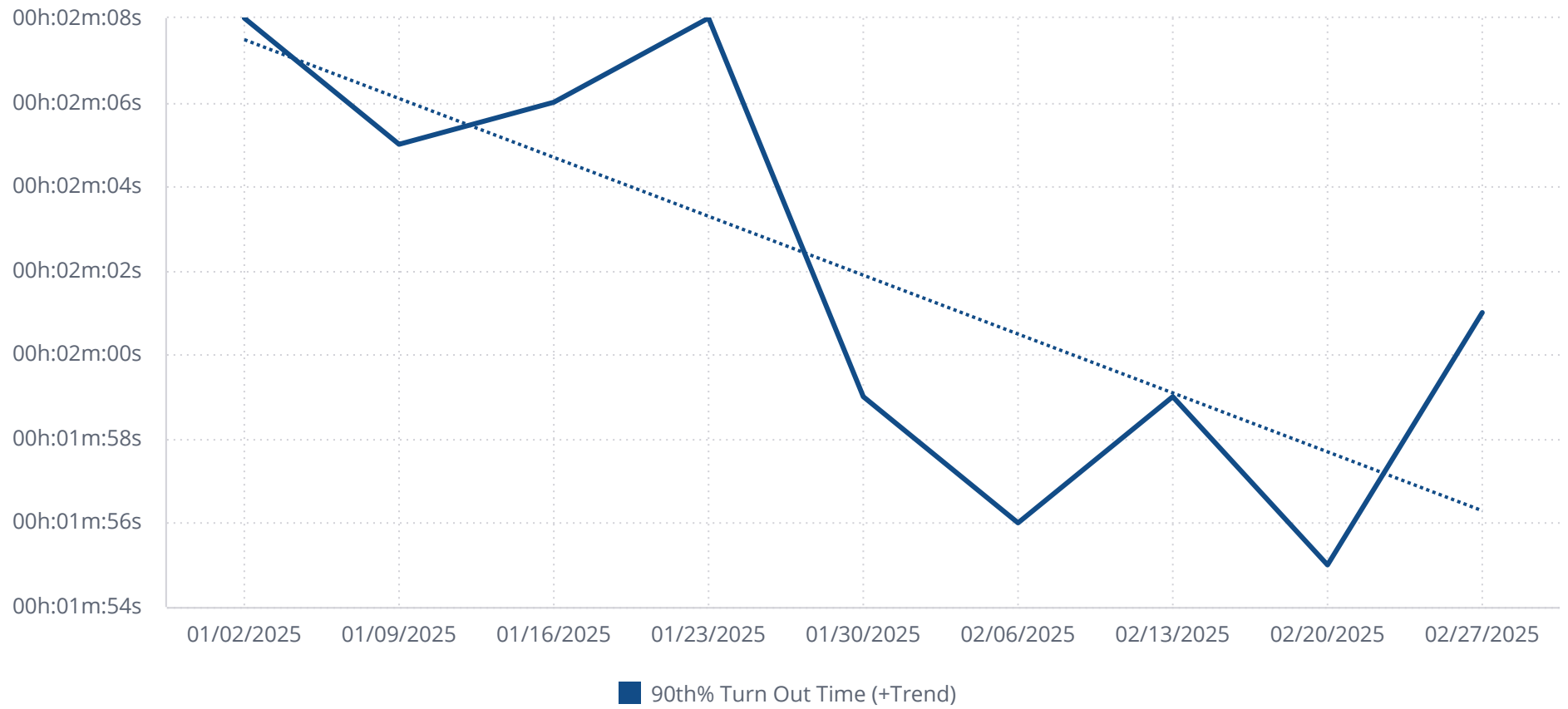
Incident Count by Month YTD

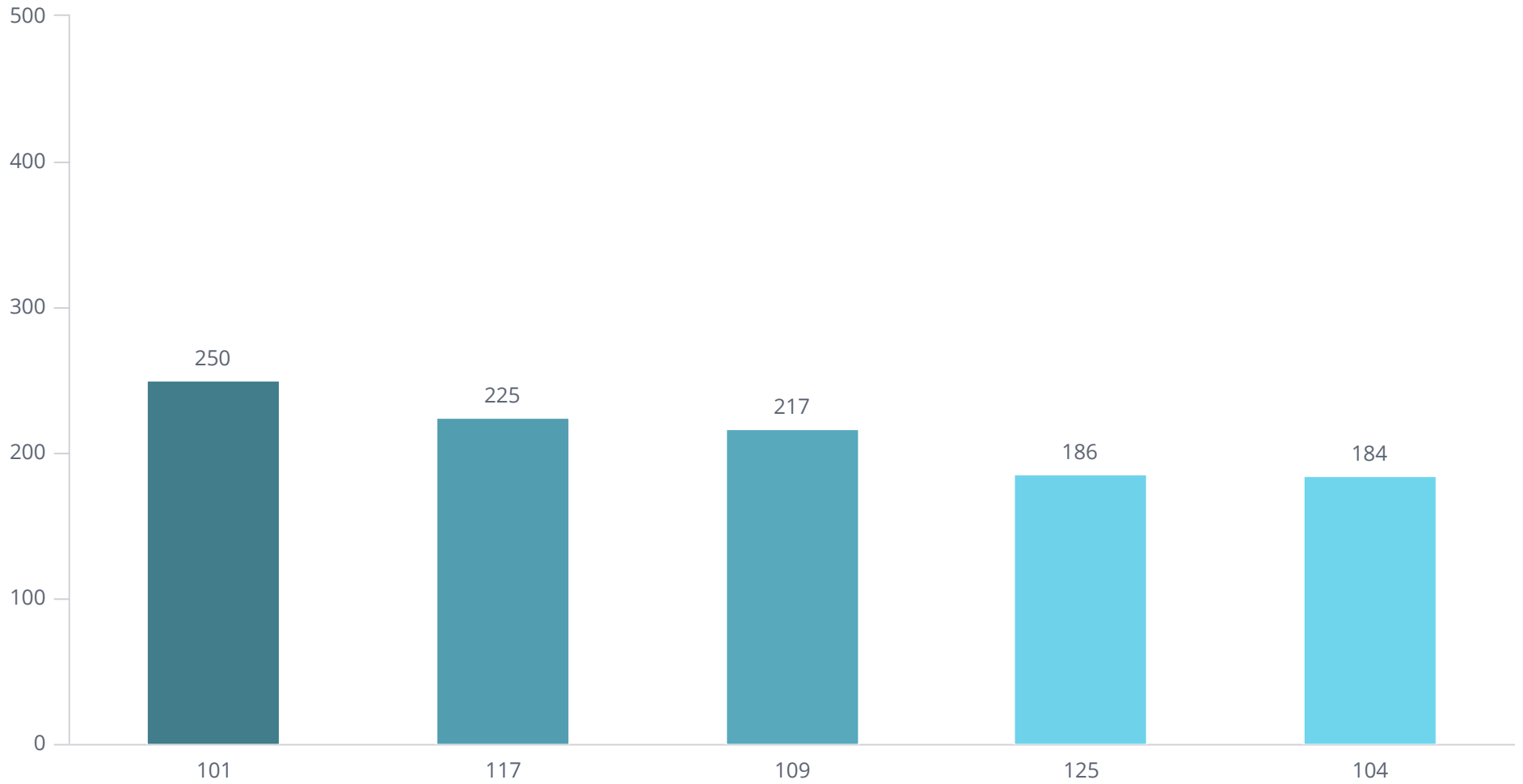

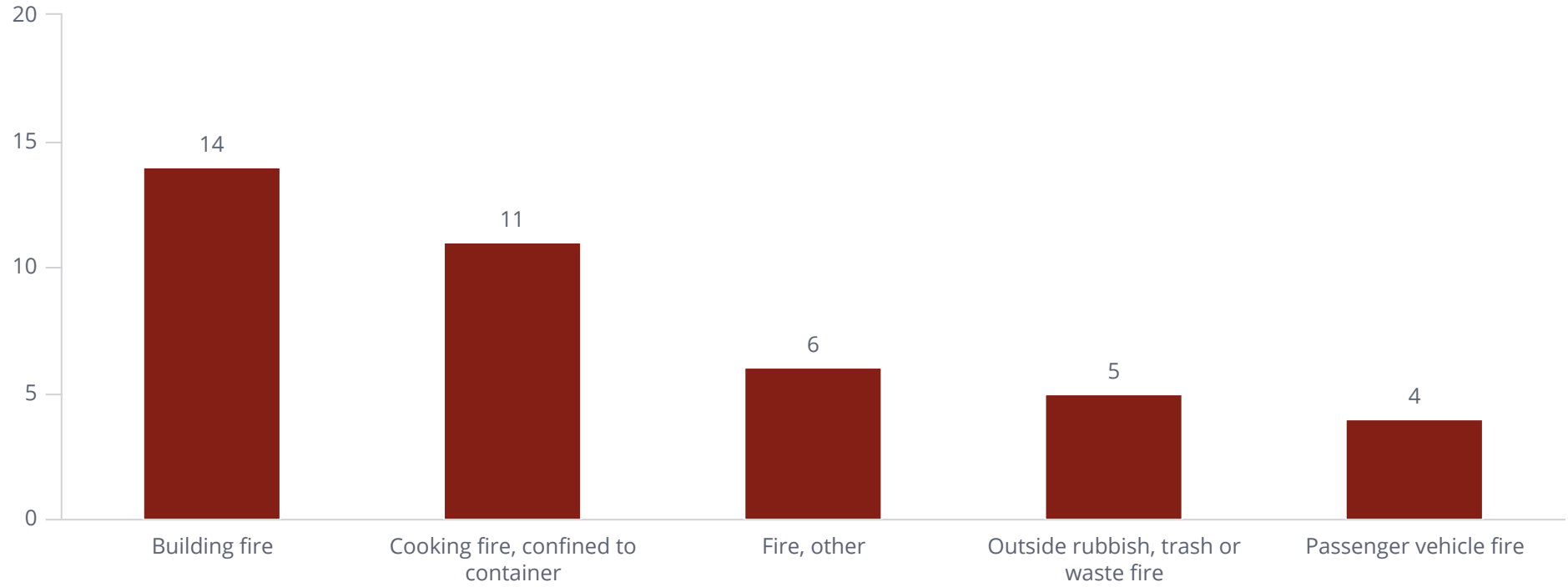

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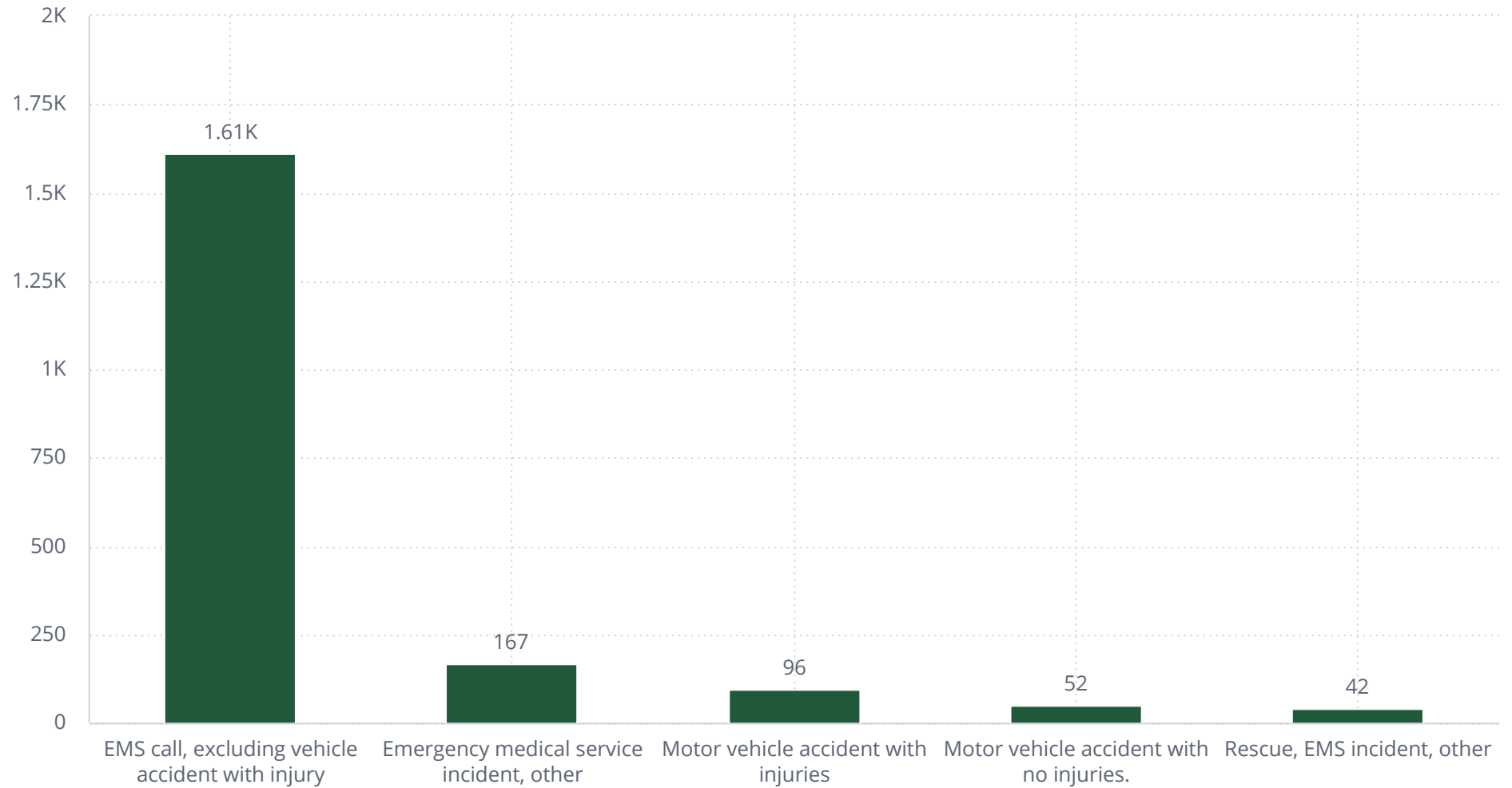
Busiest Station Top 5
