6. <u>Brighton Incorporation-Deputy County Mayor Rick Graham</u>

- Municipal Service Funds, those funds which are provided to the canyons, State Code dictates that these funds can only be used for unincorporated areas
- BCC was established as a recreation area and within State Statute it allows SLCo to fund Public Safety Services
- SLCo supports Brighton in their quest; but the challenge is that it would be unlawful for them to continue funding Public Safety Services if they incorporate

7. Fire Chief Report

- URS Firefighter Contribution Rate
 - o UFA has retained a tax attorney to explore the feasibility of an administrative solution
 - o If a solution is identified, UFA will partner with other agencies to move forward
 - o If not feasible, UFA will move in another direction

• Overtime Trial Period

- o Period has ended, but not all data has been analyzed
- o This exercise helped the issue, but did not solve it
- o There was a significant spike in sick leave during this trial period
- o The main goal of this exercise was to fill vacancies
- o Once Finance finalizes all the data; it will be brought to the Board

• Capital Replacements and Surplus-AC Watson

- o Logistics has been aggressively off-loading surplus vehicles
- o Approximately \$800,000 has been received
- o Thanks to Division Chief Robinson and all of Logistics
- o Moving forward with purchases identified in the Capital Replacement Plan

Vehicle Policy-AC Watson

- o Audit Finding #42 regarding vehicle use and identification
 - Draft policies:
 - Marking of UFA Vehicles
 - Staff Vehicle Assignment, Use and Reimbursement
 - Both policies are in the process of finalization

• Information Technology Services RFP-AC Watson

- o 9 vendors submitted bids
- o Following the sub-committee scoring; 4 have moved on
- October 22nd, the final vendors will present their proposals
- o Will bring the results to the Board once finalized

• Single Medic Trial Period-Division Chief Watkins

o Provided an overview of the single-medic trial

- o A work group was assembled and scrutinized this staffing model
- o The work group recommended implementation of this staffing model
- o Chief Petersen has decided to accept their recommendation
